CLASSROOM POLICIES

These policies are designed to create a sense of community within our large classrooms. We emphasize the effort of our students in building self-esteem, teamwork skills, and respect for others.

- 1. Students should be seated with all materials 2" Black Binder (includes music in page protectors, books), Chromebook and instrument and ready to play when class begins.
- 2. Tardiness is unacceptable, and consequences will be per the Still Middle School Student Handbook.
- 3. No gum, food, or drinks will be allowed in the band room. A water bottle is welcome!
- 4. Students must show respect for their teachers, themselves, their peers, their environment, and the music. Talking during class, playing out of turn, or causing any other disruptions is unacceptable. Appropriate consequences will be explained by the teacher.
- 5. Markings in the music should be made lightly in pencil. That's right, ONLY in pencil. <u>In the event that students cause irreversible damage to, or lose the music, they are responsible for paying for the replacement of the piece!!!</u>

GRADING

With band being a curricular class in the student's day, a quarterly grade will be given to each student. Most of the students' individual performance grades will be submitted via Google Classroom. A major portion of the band grade is based upon performance tests given during technique class. The grading process also considers rehearsal participation, attendance, concerts, written and performance tests, home practice, and daily effort. Attendance at all performances is a crucial part of the curriculum, and consequently a large part of students' grades.

GRADING FOR SCALES

Each quarter, all band students will be assigned a scale, or multiple scales to perform, record and turn in via Google Classroom. Scales are the building blocks of all music, and each scale is built using a very specific and unique series of intervals. If one interval is wrong, it changes the scale to something completely different and incorrect. All scales and arpeggios will be graded as either correct, or needs improvement. Students will be allowed to redo each scale and arpeggio as many times as necessary during that grading period, in order to get full credit.

Performances

All band members perform at least four times per year. These events are the culmination of daily rehearsals and give students the opportunity to share what they've learned. Our Concert Attendance Policy is located on the next page.

Concert Attendance Policy

- Are the 5 concert dates listed previously in this handbook entered in to your family calendar?
- Students are expected to attend all performances. Failure to attend a required concert without a valid written excuse via the Absence Request Form (<u>CLICK HERE</u>), fully explaining the absence will result in the lowering of the student's grade. The Absence Excuse Form must be received **at least 2 weeks prior** to the event in order for the excuse to be considered. Ideally all excused absences will be reported by the time the handbook is due. (Notification of emergency conflicts will be received up to one week following the concert.)
- Upon notification of an absence via the Absence Request Form, the director will acknowledge on the form that the absence is either Excused or Unexcused. An excused absence allows the student to make up the grade in the form of an alternative assignment for a possible 100%. In the case of an unexcused absence, the student will be given the opportunity to make up the event; however, the highest possible grade a student can receive will be 50%.
- For the Fine Arts Festival and February BCO concerts, Combo students must complete two separate Absence Request Forms: one submitted to their Choir Director and one submitted to their Instrumental Director.

Although it would be impossible to include a complete list, the following items are examples of **unexcused absences.**

- 1. Commitments accepted after a rehearsal or concert date is announced.
 - a. This includes ANY activity that is NOT Still Middle School related.
- 2. Homework
- 3. Transportation problems
- 4. Babysitting
- 5. Watching TV
- 6. Falling asleep
- 7. Forgetting instrument and/or music
- 8. A family member's birthday
- 9. Your birthday

TECHNIQUE CLASS

In conjunction with the daily rehearsal, the District 204 music curriculum provides an opportunity for instrumental music students to have technique classes during their ensemble rehearsal. They will be excused from a rehearsal on a rotating schedule. The benefit of technique class is that it allows for small group instruction that addresses students' specific needs. Technique schedules are listed on the grade level band calendar and posted in numerous places around the band room and music hallway.

HOME PRACTICE

Home practice helps make it possible to play a musical instrument to the best of one's ability. All band members must practice regularly at home to insure progress. The benefits of home practice include building self-confidence and pride in one's performance. <u>PRACTICE IS</u> <u>HOMEWORK!!!</u> The recommended practice goal is 20 minutes per day. Please try to include practicing in your daily homework routine. This will help maintain consistency in practicing at home.

PRIVATE LESSONS

It is <u>impossible</u> for us to overemphasize the positive impact of private lessons. Individual instruction is the best way to help students fulfill their potential. The main benefit of a private lesson is weekly one on one instruction with an expert on your particular instrument. A private instructor will immediately reinforce strengths and give specific instruction for improvement. Please request our recommended list of private instructors if this is an advantage you wish to offer your child. Private instructor information is listed on the music website.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR BAND ACTIVITIES

The Still Middle School **Wind Ensemble**, **Jazz Ensemble**, and **Exploratory Jazz Band** are designed for students wishing to broaden their musical development and participation. Membership for these ensembles is based upon student desire, musical ability, and instrumentation needs. Rehearsal times are 6:45 a.m.-7:50 a.m. The Wind Ensemble meets on Tuesdays and Fridays. The Jazz Ensemble meets on Mondays & Thursdays. **Students should arrive at 6:45 a.m. in order for rehearsals to start promptly.** Participation in the Wind Ensemble and Jazz Ensemble is determined by student auditions in the fall, and all performances are mandatory (please check the performance dates prior to audition). Audition information and materials may be obtained from the directors. The Exploratory Jazz Band will begin rehearsing after school later in the year, further information will be shared in class (no audition required).

Band students are given the opportunity to perform solos and/or ensembles at the Illinois Grade School Music Association (IGSMA) contest in February. More experienced band members also have the opportunity to audition for and perform in the Illinois Music Educator Association (IMEA) festival bands. Information for these events will be made available as they approach.

Music Uniform

All students should have the following for performances:

- · Music department polo to be ordered via PushCoin

 <u>Please Note</u>: alterations to the uniform polo are <u>NOT</u> permitted; students

 may be asked to replace an altered polo at their cost.
- · Black pants <u>no</u> jeans, shorts, skirts, or leggings.
- · Black socks Must be long enough so the ankles can not be seen when seated.
- · Black shoes shoes must be 100% BLACK, there are no exceptions. No flip-flops, and also no open-toed shoes. Completely black gym shoes are fine.

LOCKERS

Band lockers are available for each student and will be assigned during the first week of school. We ask that students store only their instrument and band related materials in their band locker.

Locks will be available to purchase through PushCoin for \$8 (www.pushcoin.com). Locks are not mandatory, but are highly recommended. If you choose to use a lock on your band locker, it MUST be purchased through PushCoin. No outside locks will be accepted.


